Sunday's Gospel:

11 Feb 2024 – 6th Sunday (Year B): Mark 1:40-45

A reflection of Sunday's Gospel:

This passage reminds us of the compassion and power of Jesus to heal the sick and the outcast. The man with leprosy was considered unclean and was required to live outside the community, separated from others. However, he took a risk and approached Jesus, begging Him to heal him.

Jesus, filled with compassion, touched the man and healed him immediately. Not only did Jesus heal him physically, but He also restored him to his community by instructing him to show himself to the priest and offer the appropriate sacrifice. This act of healing and restoration demonstrates the power and authority of Jesus to bring wholeness and reconciliation.

As we reflect on this passage, we are reminded of the importance of reaching out to those who are marginalized and in need of healing. Jesus shows us that no one is beyond His reach and that He is willing to restore both physical and spiritual health. Like the man with leprosy, we are called to approach Jesus with humility and faith, trusting in His ability to heal and restore us.

In school this week ...

We had a visit from Ms Jo Browne, a member of the Westminster Diocese team who came in to look at the whole schools RE learning.

Year 4: Focused on Jesus the teacher, exploring what different parables mean. Mrs Appleton focused on the parable of the sower and we worked together to discover the meaning/ message of the parable of the sower: "We need to look after and care for things for them to grow" and "We need to follow God's word because it teaches us how to be the best we can be".

In year 6 they focused on religious vocabulary such as a tabernacle and created a booklet sharing What you do and see in Mass.

The whole school took part in teacher and child led Collective Worship based on Racial Justice Sunday. In Year 5, they explored Inspirational people such the diverse Saint Josephine Bakhita, and explored how each key figure dedicated their life to God showing how their religious beliefs worked with the church community, making links with the Beatitudes (which means blessed).

In Reception, the children explored miracles and the wedding at Cana. Children explored this story through role play and writing invitations to weddings.
